STN's Re-Launch of The Magazine

National Federation for the Blind Bus Stop Petition

STN has signed this petition this month (Feb) alongside 164 other organisations. Active travel schemes are being introduced across the UK to accommodate cycle lanes, a good thing. What's <u>not</u> good is the introduction of 'floating bus stops', bus stops separated from the pavement as cycle lanes are sandwiched in between the pavement and the stop. Some designs include bus passengers having to step into a live cycle lane to get on and off a bus. These complex, differently designed systems leave visually impaired people totally disorientated, confused and unable to navigate safely.
