These are the key issues discussed at the 14th January meeting:

- New recording equipment has been successfully installed over the Christmas period
- Plans for a Celebratory Music concert in September are starting to come together
- Trevor reminded us we needed £2500 for annual STN running costs and we have £8216.38 in the bank
- Nearly all of planned project expenditure for the past year has been matched with donations, with more funding to come shortly
- There are currently 76 Listeners receiving STN by Royal Mail
- Gill requested that all USB sticks have 'Bumpons' (tactile labelling) attached for ease of use
- The next AGM would be held on Tuesday 18th November 2025 at 11.30 a.m.

- 5. You can resubmit articles that didn't make the cut first time round for any reason other than they weren't good enough!! David archives Whitby Museum and Maritime Heritage contributions and uses articles identified from Mary's playlist other recordings are deleted from his system for storage maintenance purposes.
- 6. David asks that we remember to include a 10 second environmental recording before we start to speak. This allows him to judge how much cleanup to apply to the whole piece (removing background hums etc). This may not be possible for external events and interviews etc.
