These are the key issues discussed at the 4th March meeting:

- STN is receiving offers of support through Bex Blakey, Community Engagement Officer at SeeCHANGE.
- We have been given a large donation by Scarborough 41Club (see below).
- Steph Brown has stepped down as Secretary and the Committee will propose that Sylvia Brabbs takes over the role. Steph was thanked for her input.
- There will be an Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM) prior to the next Committee meeting on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> April for the necessary formal procedures to take place. All STN Volunteers and Listeners will be given formal notice of this by email and broadcast.
- Applicants for Reader volunteering will be put on a waiting list and applicants will be asked if they would consider training as Recorders, Copiers or Despatchers instead.
- The quality and coverage of items in local newspapers was discussed.
- A full Technical Manager Report is available to be read in the minute book in the Despatch Room.
- Old studio equipment is being recycled and we will shortly have the Studio clad.
- Listener numbers (posted USBs only) are currently 69. Numbers of returned pouches has fluctuated between 51 and 62 since January.

- Discussion about the proposed new CIO Constitution continued and further clarity will be necessary before the document is sent to the Charity Commission for approval.
